# President's Message by Kathy Young

Thank you to our members who have taken the time to tell their stories to the Board of Supervisors. Some have made presentations to the Board of Supervisors, many have sent letters and emails. We encourage you to continue to let the BOS know that the delay in granting appropriate COLAs increases the impact. Many spoke during the budget hearings in April. Although some of the Supervisors appear interested, the issue continues to be pushed down the road. SCERA brought forward 4 different one-time COLA funding scenarios. The BOS asked the County Council to investigate what is feasible under the law. No specific timeframe was given. It is important that we do not let up getting our message that COLAs are desperately needed to the BOS. More on COLAs on page 3.

Next steps for your SCARE Board include establishing a PAC or Political Action Committee which would allow us to support County Supervisors or those running for office who we believe would assist county retirees in getting COLAs and maintaining medical benefits. We also want to make sure that retirees and new hires know there have been no COLAs since 2008. Phyris has been working with SCERA and they have agreed to change the wording in their written handout "After Retirement" to show there has been no COLA since 2008. In researching what information is given to new hires, there does not appear to be any information that shows we do not have regular COLAs. We are going to ask that that a statement be included with HR materials showing retiree benefits. And yes, that would likely affect recruitment as some people will not come to Sonoma County if they know a retirement COLA is not guaranteed.

At our next SCARE Membership Meeting in addition to getting an update on COLA efforts, Joni Huntsperger will let us know about the Master Plan for Aging in Sonoma County. For more on the Master Plan, see page 5 of the newsletter

# **August 26th Membership Meeting Speaker**

Joni Huntsperger will be the speaker at our Membership Meeting and will give us an update on what is happening with the Sonoma County Master Plan for Aging. This is a ten-year plan highlighting the community's most pressing needs and corresponding strategies for its aging population which is growing rapidly. There are 6 committees addressing different needs like housing, transportation, health and economic security (very relevant to us as we try to get COLA). See details on different committees on page 5. They can use more people on these committees and Joni can fill us in on details of time commitment for those who might want to be involved.

# **Emergency Prep Help (EPH)**

Seniors are the fastest growing demographic in Sonoma County and in California. They are also the most vulnerable in emergencies and disasters for a variety of reasons. EPH provides workshops for seniors that provide information and strategies on what to do to prepare for an emergency and what to do in an emergency. As part of the 2 session workshop, you get a go-bag with supplies and a great deal of information. They have workshops in various parts of the county. They have workshops in August in Santa Rosa and Sebastopol, in September in Santa Rosa, Petaluma and Guerneville. More online. There are 2 sessions 2-3 weeks apart, each one being 2 hours. Anyone 55 and older can attend free.

# **Ongoing Effort to Get COLAs**

We are in a holding pattern after the presentation to the Board of Supervisors. They were very receptive to need for COLAs and referred it to County Council to look at ways legislation could allow them more flexibility in giving COLAs but the budget for 2025-26 has been approved without a COLA in it. It is still crucial that members participate in this effort by writing letters to the Board of Supervisors, attending Board meetings and participating in the public comment period. The BOS pays attention to this. SCARE Board member, Andre Bercut, will be coordinating these efforts. If you write to the BOS, (Board addresses below) please remember to cc him at andre.bercut@gmail.com, and add whether you are willing to be part of a team appearing at BOS meetings. When writing to your Board member, it is very important to state how the increase in the cost of living without a COLA has personally affected you.

SCARE Board members have met with all members of the Board of Supervisors and with the County CAO, Christina Rivera, to ask them to seriously consider giving retirees a COLA. Following are some of the points we made to the Board of Supervisor members when we met with them. You may want to include some of them in your letters.

- ♦ Sonoma County's Ad Hoc COLA which promises to keep retirees at 80 is not working. Sonoma County retirees have not been granted a cost of living increase since 2008, and those who retired after 2003, have never gotten a COLA. Other public agencies in California have automatic COLAs which means they get a 2 or 3% COLA every year. County said they would give COLAs to keep retirees at 80% of purchasing power.
- ♦ About half of retirees get \$2,500 or less—and sometimes much less. There are people who retired in the 1970s, 1980s and 1990s when salaries were much lower compared to today's, so they have very low pensions. There are 765 retirees who retired before April 1999 who have lost 78% of their Purchasing Power as of March 2025, and they started out with very low pensions. - ♦ 32% of Safety retirements and 5% of General retirement are based on duty disabilities. They are younger, often with families and high health insurance costs, and they average \$1,000/month less than regular service retirements. They are many years away from being Medicare eligible.
- Having no COLA affects the County's ability to hire and retain employees.
- Sonoma County has a very high cost of living, but if retirees move, they often have very high health insurance costs unless they are Medicare eligible.
- As retirees age, their costs go up as their health deteriorates and they need to hire people to do what they did earlier. Or they may need to go into assisted living which is very expensive.
- ♦ The Board of Supervisors has shown that they care about older people as they adopted a comprehensive Master Plan for Aging, ensuring that the increasingly aging population can age with dignity and independence. But they seem to have forgotten about their own retirees.

In addition to our discussion with the BOS about COLAs, we are also asking them to modifying the SCARE settlement agreement and increase their contribution for those impacted as it is due to decrease to \$200/month in July 2026.

Health Insurance Information

Health Reimbursement Accounts Transferred to TASC — Do not throw away letter coming from TASC that Includes debit card. This only applies to the people under the SCARE settlement who have HRAs (retired before 7/11/6). The county finally made the deposit of the reallocated funds and TASC has mailed out the debit card along with information on how to register and use the TASC system. The amount reallocated to members is \$26.06. To access this money, you will have to use the debit card or file a new claim with TASC so that future amounts will be paid automatically. The other thing you will need to do is to set up your direct deposit information with TASC as that was not transferred either. Since the deposit was made so late, the service charge of \$2 is waived for July but will come out of your account in August so unless you file claim right away, you will only have \$24.66. The advantage of TASC over P&A is that the service charge is lower and they pay interest. For those of you who keep your balance to 0, the interest won't affect you but for those of you who were hired after 7/1/09 and have larger balances in your HRA to use for your health insurance, you will now accrue interest on these funds. It will show up on your online account.

Steps for setting up online account with TASC (thanks to Ed Clites for this info):

1. Logh to www.tasconline.com
2. Click the logh button
3. Click on 'First Time Here/Sign-up
4. Fill in the requested personal information including your 12 digit TASC ID which can be found on the back of your debit card (or call customer services at 877-401-8907)
5. You should now see your dashboard with a balance of \$26.66

To file claim:
1. Click on Request a Reimbursement (best to claim large amount so balance remains on file)
2. Fill in the requested personal information including your 12 digit TASC ID which can be found on the back of your debit card (or call customer services at 877-401-8907)

## **Fact Checking Social Media Posts**

There have been a lot of misleading posts on social media for a long time. But with AI, they are getting much more sophisticated. For instance, they now show photos of people saying and doing things that are not real but it looks like the person and sounds like them. Sometimes there are little clues that it is a fraud but not always. These then get circulated as if they are the truth.

**Snopes.com** is a website that tries to check these out and debunk the ones that are not true and it also shows ones that are true. This will not help if someone is out to scam you in particular but it will allow you to check things that are circulating on social media.

While there have been many warnings about scams, we have to be even more careful now as there are so many ways to mislead us.

For other major stories, circulated on the news or on social media, you can go to **FactCheck.org**. They cover stories that are happening on a national level and often go into a lot of detail.
